Rose Haven is a low-barrier day shelter and community center serving all women, children, and marginalized genders. Focusing on those living with housing insecurity, we promote a safe and respectful space that provides guests with support, essential services and community connections to assist them in regaining stability. Rose Haven welcomes guests of all backgrounds, identities and experiences.

Multnomah County Statistics

- Poverty is not Colorblind -

African Americans are 13% of the local population

African Americans are 40% of people experiencing homelessness

African Americans are 51% of people experiencing homelessness as members of families with children



Due to COVID-19 homelessness could grow as much as 45% in a year

Rose Haven has been open throughout the pandemic, providing sanctuary for women, children, and transgender who have no place to shelter in.

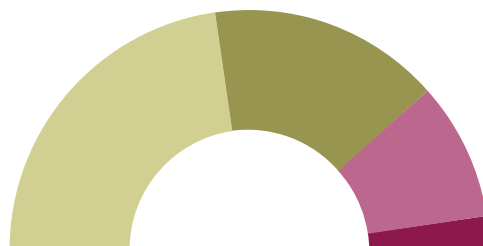
Advocacy Snapshot
